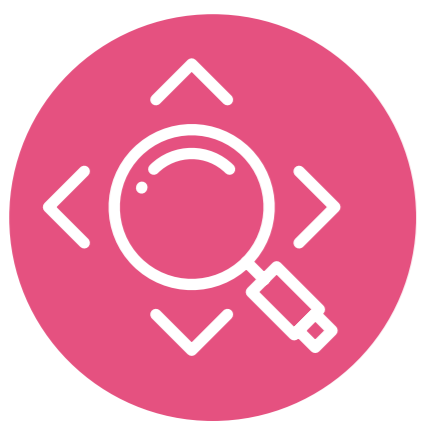

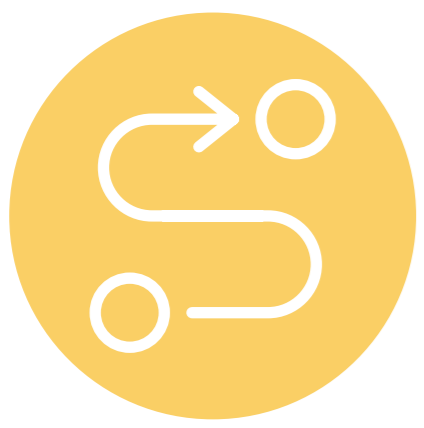
Autism: Strengths

Understanding, embracing and celebrating different kinds of minds benefits everyone. Think about how these autistic strengths bring value to our families and communities.



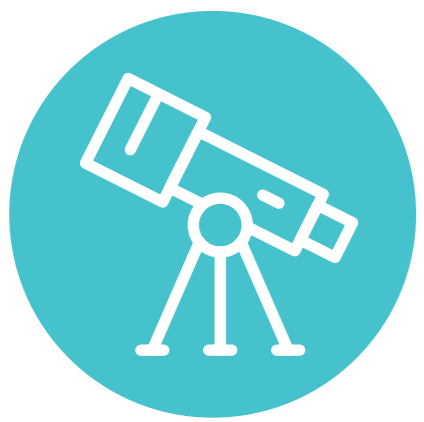
Attention to detail

- » Thoroughness

- » Concentration
- » Freedom from distraction



Observational skills

- » Listen, look, learn approach
- » Fact finding



Absorb and retain facts

- » Excellent long-term memory
- » Superior recall



Visual skills

- » Visual learning and recall
- » Detail-focused



Expertise

- » In-depth knowledge
- » High level of skills



Methodical approach

- » Analytical
- » Spotting patterns, repetition



Novel approaches

- » Unique thought processes
- » Innovative solutions



Creativity

- » Distinctive imagination
- » Expression of ideas



Tenacity and resilience

- » Determination
- » Challenge opinions



Accepting of difference

- » Less likely to judge others
- » May question norms



Integrity

- » Honesty, loyalty
- » Commitment
