By using developmentally appropriate practices, communicating with, and supporting parents, and being aware of community-based resources, education providers can make important contributions to the lives of Autistic children and their families.

- » An understanding of the core characteristics of autism and their impact on individuals' development
- » Knowledge of the thinking and understanding differences that autistic children may have
- » An awareness of the sensory sensitivities that Autistic students may be living with
- » Awareness of the impacts that autism can have on behaviour, communication and the ability to relate socially
- » Strategies for communicating effectively and creating learning environments that cater to the diverse needs of Autistic students
